

Freedom of Information Request - 4214

Current A&E GP streaming service:

1. What are the opening hours?

9am-9.30pm 7 days a week (subject to filling shifts)

2. How many GPs do you have working at any one time?

One GP and One Nurse Practitioner at peak times, other times either GP or Nurse Practitioner subject to uptake of shifts

3. What is the hourly pay?

£80 per hour for GP; Nurse Practitioner at Band 7 salary

4. What is the seniority mix?

The GPs have a range of experience - some have just finished their GP registrar training, whereas some are very experienced (10+ years as a GP). All our ANPs are senior practitioners with several years of experience as Nurse Practitioners and are registered nurse prescribers

5. How many GPs do you have and how many vacancies?

No salaried GPs. One salaried Nurse Practitioner on 30hres per week. GP shifts are on a "bank shift" basis, but with a core group of 4 GPs covering a mixture of regular shifts and ad hoc Nurse Practitioner cover Sunday 9-5. Evenings on an ad hoc basis with approx. 30% fill.

- 6. What proportion are:
 - a) locums all GP shifts are done on a "bank shift" basis
 - b) from local practices all participating GPs are local some do locum sessions in local practices, whilst other do almost exclusively JPUH streaming work
 - **c) employed by the Trust -** all are employed by the trust GPs on a "bank" basis paid by the hour, Nurse Practitioners on a substantive basis
